- To provide clinicians with investigator support to allow time away from practice to carry out research projects.
- To provide support over an adequate period of time such that research projects can be carried through the stages of planning, development, grant writing, successful funding, implementation, analysis, presentation, and publication.
- To support clinician-investigators who remain in active community-based practice such that they can develop their questions from their practice and translate the knowledge back into practice.
- To have these clinician-investigators serve as mentors and role models for other family physicians in

residency training and practice.

The program will aim to support Community-Based Clinician-Investigators from both rural and urban environments. It is geared towards family physicians who are able to demonstrate previous research skill development and previous successful research project completion, publication, and grant writing success. Family physicians with less research background than this are encouraged to apply to our "Clinical Investigator Program", which is targeted toward the less-experienced researcher.

This is a very exciting program and a great step forward for family medicine research.
